Undergraduate Faculty Supervised Research Opportunities in Rural Development

Oregon State University Extension supports the economic development efforts of rural communities across the state. Complete the experiential learning component of your degree program by assisting Dr. Mallory Rahe with her on-going applied research projects. The following projects have different timelines but can all be somewhat flexible to accommodate students who wish to start over the summer or to balance this work while taking classes in the Fall, Winter, or next Spring. The majority of the work for all of these projects can occur in Corvallis and students will have the opportunity to shape their contribution to the overall project. Some travel to the specified location may be needed to gather information or discuss results. Small research grants may be available.

- Measuring and communicating changes in agriculture and local food production. Location: Campus with statewide webinars and email distributions.
