Last day to change to S/U Grading and Withdraw from a class:

The last day to change from A/F to S/U grading is Friday, May 18 and you will need a form signed by myself. I have those in my office. If you need to withdraw from a class that you will do online, just as you would drop a class, but it will say withdraw and remain on your transcript. In addition, to let you know if you plan to withdraw from all of your classes, the Registrar's Office has put in a survey before you withdraw from your last class. You would need to complete the survey before you completely withdraw from all of your classes. Again, if any of you has any questions on any of this, please contact me.

Chile Study Abroad – Winter Term 2019

Here is a study abroad opportunity. I received this email and wanted to pass it along.

I am a faculty member in the School of Public Policy and I am leading a 10-week, 15-credit study abroad program in Chile next winter quarter (2109) that I'm hoping that you can promote to your students. I've attached a poster and students can get additional information and apply on the OSU Global Opportunities website:

I will be holding drop-in informational sessions in 208 Bexell (the CLA "livingroom") on Monday (5/14), Wednesday 5/23, Thursday 5/31, and Monday 6/4 from noon-2.

I think that this program is structured to make it appealing to students in the following ways:

- 1) The cost per credit hour is lower than almost any other study abroad program available.
- 2) The program fulfills two bacc-core requirements, so counts toward degree completion rather than just providing electives credits.
- 3) The program includes 3 credits of Spanish focusing on the culture of Chile.
- 4) It allows students to nearly completely avoid winter in Corvallis and instead enjoy 10 weeks of summer in South America.

- 5) Chillán is less than an hour from the ocean and the same distance from the Andes for surfing, hiking and other recreational pursuits.
- 6) Chile is a very popular, safe, and friendly destination for study abroad programs but Chillán is not as tourist/student filled as other cities.
- 7) Florencia Casanova, who is the home-stay/site coordinator and Spanish instructor, has been organizing study abroad programs in Chile for OSU for nearly 20 years.
- 8) For students who are reluctant to "go off on their own" it can be reassuring to be studying and traveling with other OSU students and instructors.
- 9) Because the program will have the same tuition structure as ECampus, it will be cheaper for nonresident students than spending the quarter in Corvallis.
- 10) Financial Aid awards can be applied to the program and scholarships (up to \$2,000) are available from both CLA and ECampus (don't have to be an ECampus student).
